Joe Nichols to headline WIRK Rib Round Up

Joe Nichols, yet another hunky country singer with a feel-good vibe, will headline the sixth annual 103.1 WIRK Rib Round Up on March 7 at the Cruzan Amphitheatre, the radio station announced Monday.

The concert also will include Craig Morgan, Gloriana, Thompson Square, Dustin Lynch and two main-stage acts to be named on Feb. 1, says Sammy Cruise, program director at the West Palm Beach-based WIRK.

"We try to get a sleeper in there, but everything just fell into place," he says. "They all have hits."

Nichols, 38, who exudes country-gentleman charm, had a No. 1 smash this summer with "Yeah" from his album "Crickets." His other Top 10s include "Sunny and 75," "Brokenheartsville," "Tequila Makes Her Clothes Fall Off" and "What's a Guy Gotta Do."

Nichols is now touring on his own, after spending the summer opening for Lady Antebellum. He also is starting to get recognition outside country radio, with a short profile running in a recent edition of People magazine and an appearance on ABC's "Nashville."

Tickets to the Rib Round Up cost \$40 for lawn seating and \$70 for a seat in the amphitheater, and are available at WIRK.com. The event will include about 10 vendors selling ribs, ranging from full plates to "buck-a-bone" samples.

Cruise says WIRK is also muscling up the secondary stage, near the rib vendors. The day will include up-and-coming performers, many of which are new Nashville acts. Those names will be announced later.

'Annie' stars Foxx, Wallis, Diaz to appear in Miami

Stars of new film set to visit Bayside Marketplace on Tuesday.

It's only a day away: On Tuesday morning, Jamie Foxx, Quvenzhané Wallis and other stars of the forthcoming "Annie" film adaptation will gather at Miami's Bayside Marketplace for "Annie Day."

The Will Smith- and Jay-Z-produced movie is being inducted into the Official Miami Walk of Fame, with a Romero Britto-designed blue star embedded in the sidewalk flagpole entrance at Bayside. Also collecting a star is Emmy

winner and former Coconut Creek resident Bobby Cannavale, of "Boardwalk Empire" and the Miami-set independent film "Chef."

Miami Mayor Tomas Regalado will proclaim Dec. 9 "Annie Day" in partnership with the nonprofit Our Kids of Miami-Dade/Monroe, which raises funds for foster children. Also appearing onstage will be co-star Cameron Diaz and director Will Gluck.

In theaters Dec. 19, the film stars Wallis as the titular big-haired orphan and Foxx as Daddy Warbucks-type Will Stacks. They won't be

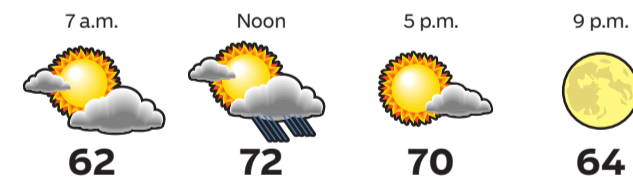

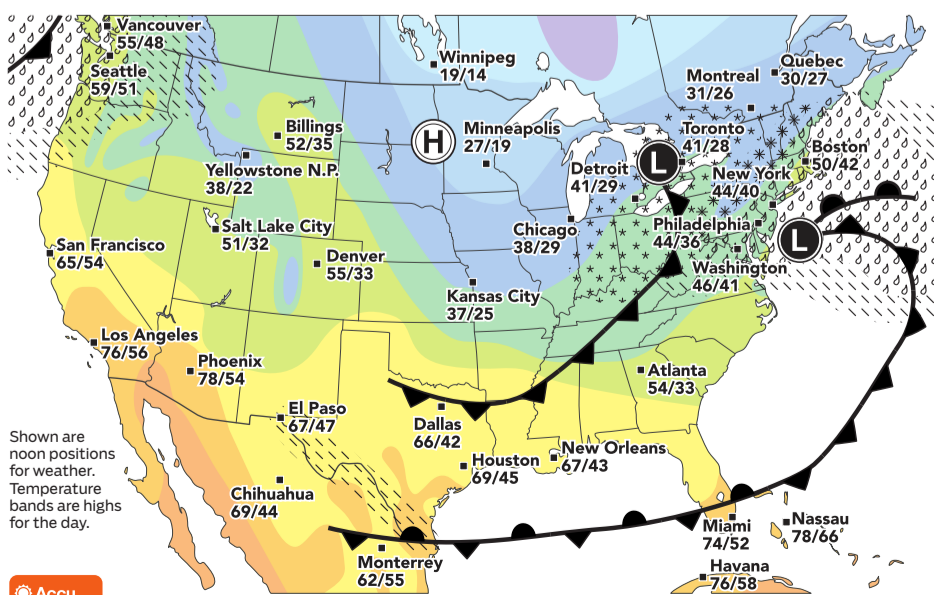
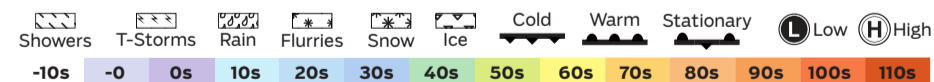
