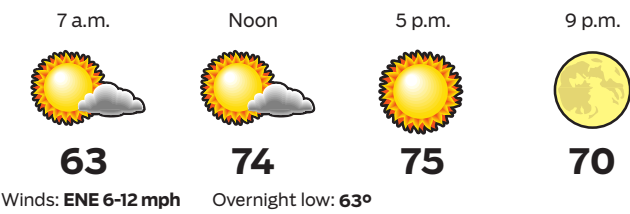

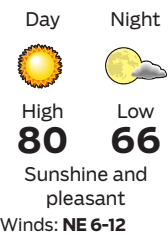

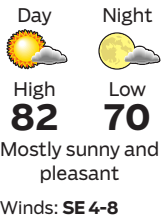
Today will be sunny with light winds. Look for mostly clear skies tonight with cool temperatures and light winds.

The 20th annual Palm Beach International Film Festival aims to end on a strong note with closing-night film “While We’re Young,” director Noah Baumbach’s exploration of aging Generation X’ers and fading ambition starring Ben Stiller, Naomi Watters and Charles Grodin. (Baumbach also made the terrific “Frances Ha.”) The screening will take place 7 p.m. Thursday at Cinemark Palace 20 (3200 Airport Road, Boca Raton), followed by the “It’s a Wrap” party at sake lounge Yoko San (99 SE Mizner Blvd., No. 110). \$10.75 for the film, \$75 for the party and film, which includes one ticket, two vodka cocktails and light appetizers. The imaginative, often spastic electronic pop of Tune-Yards’ Merrill Garbus is plenty evident on her third album, “Nikki Nack,” a collision of quiet ballads, smart vocals, African polyrhythms and Haitian drum patterns. Garbus released the music video to her single “Wait for a Minute,” an acid trip of looping harmonies, checkerboardlike digital effects and psychedelic colors.
