Blues rock from Black Keys

The double-whammy of the Black Keys with opener St. Vincent Monday night at the BB&T Center sure sounds like a strong lineup on paper. The hard-charging psychedelia of "Turn Blue," the blues-rock duo's newest album, along with standout single "Fever," is filled with nods to Sly Stone, Muddy Waters and the Clash. Plus, the Black Keys' 2010 album "El Camino" is another well of soulful

greatness Akron boys Dan Auerbach and Patrick Carney have been drawing from in recent setlists. Meanwhile, St. Vincent, the nom de freaky of Annie Clark, is hardly a slouch with the electric guitar. Christmas, a time for family, good-hearted cheer and for affecting your favorite Jimmy-Stewart-as-George-Bailey accent, is in full swing at Delray Beach's Arts Garage (180 NE First St.). Throw a lasso around the moon with Wednesday night's performance of "It's a Wonderful Life," which will be presented in a format more old-fashioned than the Frank Capra film ever was: as a radio play. If all 11 studio albums by blues guitarist Joe Bonamassa sound old school, the world can blame B.B. King. He opened for the Mississippi Delta legend at age 12, setting off Bonamassa's blues-rock career and his drive for preserving the music form in smoking-hot covers of Bill Withers' "Lonely Town Lonely Street," Willie Dixon's "I Got All You Need" and John Lee Hooker's "Burning Hell." His performance Thursday at Hard Rock Live (1 Seminole Way, Hollywood) will promote "Different Shades of Blue," his first new album of original songs in a decade, which debuted at No. 8 on the Billboard 200 chart. Sunday

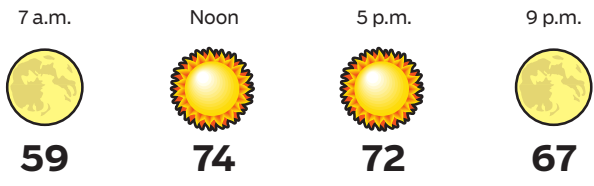

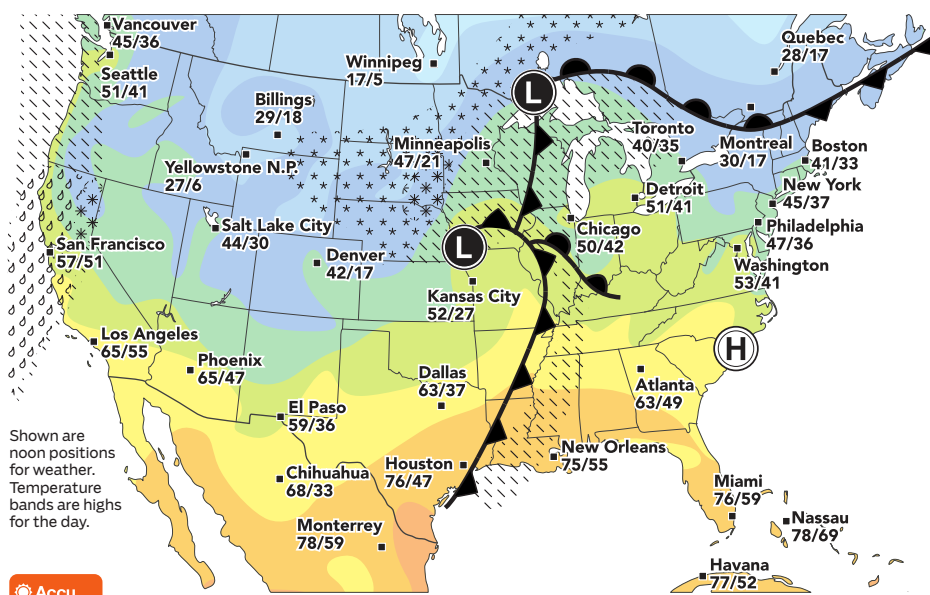
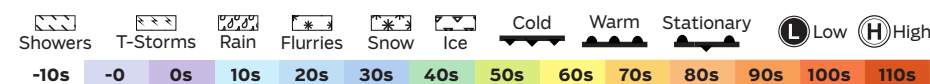
