On Monday, the crafty sorcerers behind Funky Buddha Brewery will pair up with Delaware's Dogfish Head Craft Brewery to brew a special batch of Nano Nano, a dark imperial porter the breweries invented last year at a beer festival. Dogfish Head founder Sam Calagione, a six-time James Beard Award finalist, is in town this week to help re-create Nano Nano, made with cocoa, molasses, smoked habanero peppers and sea salt from Florida and Delaware's coasts. Calagione and head Buddha brew master Ryan Sentz first concocted Nano Nano at last year's Boston Extreme Beer Fest. The brewery (1201 NE 38th St., Oakland Park) will mark the occasion with a 6 p.m. party and tap takeover called Nano-Nano Beer and Bites Pairing, featuring 11 Dogfish Head brews and old Buddha favorite Maple Bacon Coffee Porter. Kyle Eastwood, accomplished jazz bassist and son of Clint, has been riding a wave of success that has had much to do with influences from dad. Since his 1998 debut album, "From Here to There" (Joni Mitchell makes a guest appearance), Eastwood has recorded arrangements on 10 movie soundtracks, including his father's "Million Dollar Baby" and "Jersey Boys." Eastwood and his band come to Jazziz Nightlife (201 Plaza Real, Boca Raton) bearing a new album, "Time-pieces," which is filled with hard-bop covers of "Dolphin Dance" by Herbie Hancock and "Blowin' the Blues Away" by Horace Silver. 7-10 P.M. Country on the sand

Country music's finest hip-swinging crooners will trudge through South Florida's surf and sand once again for Rock the Ocean's Tortuga Music Festival on Saturday and Sunday. Saturday's deliverers of twangy sun-soaked vibes will be led by Kenny Chesney, along with hitmakers Jake Owen, Trace Adkins, David Nail and, for a twist, the

Doobie Brothers, whose 2014 album, "Southbound," plants the classic rockers in country territory. The country-and-conservation-themed concert will also feature environmental exhibits at Conservation Village. 11 a.m.-10:15 p.m. each day. \$99 for a single-day pass, \$165 for both days. Wednesday

At least 25 restaurants will sling food, wine and other comforts during the 20th annual Expo Alfresco, returning 5-8 p.m. Wednesday to Hollywood's ArtsPark at Young Circle (1 N. Young Circle). Also returning is the Firehouse Cook Off Show-down, pitting city and county fire departments in a contest to produce the best-tasting appetizer, main course and dessert. Since this is more a trade show than a food festival, dozens of local business will also congregate at ArtsPark, with vendors selling jewelry and handcrafted wares. Thursday

The one-two gut punch of comedy packed into Thursday night's Patton Oswalt and Dave Chappelle performances, part of the South Beach Comedy Festival, may be the funniest thing worth seeing all year. Oswalt, the prolific comic known for delivering essay-length rants on Twitter (see last week's screed about "The Daily Show" replacement host Trevor Noah), has a new book titled "Silver Screen Fiend," a memoir about his unhealthy 1990s addiction to movies. Last year, he released the special "Tragedy Plus Comedy Equals Time," which contains a Miami-centric bit about weightlifter dudes and alpha-male aggression. Chappelle, meanwhile, returns to South Florida for the first time since December 2013. Oswalt will perform at 7:30 p.m. (\$35-\$39.50) and Chappelle will perform at 10 p.m. Thursday, 11 p.m. Saturday and 8 p.m. Sunday (\$58.75-\$68.75) at Fillmore Miami Beach (1700 Washington Ave., Miami Beach). 305-673-7300 or FillmoreMB.com.

Friday

Friday kicks off the three-day gathering of paddleboarding, kayaking and fellowship known as the South Florida Beach Festival, benefiting the Boca Raton nonprofit Surfers for Autism. Friday's action unfolds on the beach at 149 SE 21st Ave., in Deerfield Beach (about three blocks south of the Deerfield Beach pier), with food trucks (Latin Grill, Che Grill and others), a beverage garden and music from headlining indie rockers Surfer Blood, along with Steel Margarita, Buddy Sparrow and Time With Tom. Festivalgoers can also bear witness to children and young adults with autism gaining therapeutic value from surfing waves for the first time. Free. SurfersForAutism.org.



Sunday

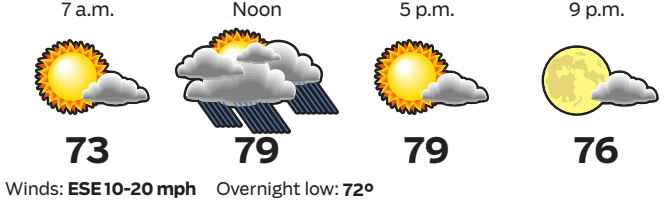

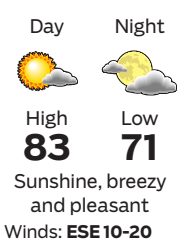


Jeff Berardelli's outlook
