

Alexa Heller steps up

The dancer-turned-singer will play homecoming show at Jazziz Nightlife.

Alexa Heller decided to be a professional dancer early on. The South Floridian began dancing ballet, tap and jazz at 4. Before she was 10, she had already performed in "The Nutcracker" with the Miami City Ballet.

But when she turned 13, a series of events crushed her dreams. While Heller was recovering from a hip injury, a blood vessel malformation caused a benign tumor in her brain that required emergency surgery. Later, she discovered she had torn cartilage in her hip, and wouldn't be able to pursue a dancing career.

"The thing that I loved the most was all of a sudden taken away from me," says Heller, 25. "It really dawned

upon me that I had to find something else to do with my time."

While emotionally healing from those experiences, Heller couldn't identify or connect with other teenagers, and therapy didn't make her feel better. So she began writing songs as a way to express herself.

She moved to New York after high school, and released her first album, titled "Alexa," in 2013. She'll perform her pop-R&B for the first time in South Florida on Sunday at Jazziz Nightlife in Boca Raton.

"I came home because I want to be with the community, and I want to show the love I have for them, and be around a lot of love," she says.

Before dedicating herself to music, Heller tried acting, and received several rejections at Broadway

auditions. Her childhood experiences, she says, have made her tough.

"You just have to keep reinventing who you are, because you can't predict what life will bring to you," she says. "I learned to try on my own, and start creating my own work."

Heller worked as an extra on the movie "Step Up 3D." During filming, she met professional break dancers who partly inspired her first album.

"I was just inspired by how those dancers made their dreams come true," she says. "I was like, 'Wow. If they can do it, I can do it.'"

Heller's album is also inspired by 1980s pop and hip-hop rhythms, and Madonna, whom she considers a role model.

"She was a dancer at first, and then she moved to New York by herself," Heller says. "She was auditioning for Broadway, too. And she ended up doing her own music."

In her lyrics, Heller often taps into love, overcoming obstacles and dating. A new song, "Gentlemen," describes the man Heller hopes to find: respectful, understanding, responsible and fun.

"To me, that's what this song is about. It's for Millennials who want true love, and want to be treated with respect, and want to create something that's deeper than just a hookup," Heller says.

"People live ordinary [lives], and I want to live in a world that is extraordinary," she says. "And I want to bring people with me on my journey through my music."
