### Rubio, Murphy Senate race attracts big dollars

With control of the U.S. Senate at stake, money pouring into the race between Sen. Marco Rubio and U.S. Rep. Patrick Murphy is outpacing Florida's past congressional elections. Rubio's campaign has raised about \$20 million and Murphy's campaign raised \$11 million through Sept. 30, according to recent filings to the Federal Election Commission.

For Rubio, that's already more than the \$17.2 million he raised in his initial run for Senate in 2010, according to the commission. And it's also more than

the nearly \$17 million Sen. Bill Nelson raised in his 2012 re-election race, according to federal records.

The money keeps flowing into this year's race because both Republicans and Democrats think winning Florida's seat can help them win control of the Senate, according to David Keating, president of the Center for Competitive Politics.

"Florida is probably one of the biggest competitive states. There are a lot of media markets all over the state. It costs a lot money to run in Florida," said Keating, whose organization advocates for easing limits on campaign advertising by corporations, unions and others.

### Clinton, Trump crisscross state

COCONUT CREEK — Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump both focused their campaigns Tuesday on Florida, one of the closest battlegrounds in the country.

Appearing at a Broward College campus on the second day of in-person early voting, Clinton's 27-minute speech was standard political fare. She praised local Democratic politicians, extensively promoted U.S. Senate candidate Patrick Murphy, then turned to Trump, whom she alternately chastised and mocked.

In a voice that sounded more gravelly than usual, Clinton also pushed the laundry lists of policies that she's known for, such as universal pre-kindergarten education, affordable college and clean energy jobs.

"This is a crossroads election that's going to determine so much what kind of country we have in the dec-

### Two arrested in crackdown on drug-treatment providers

An investigation involving more than 10 law enforcement agencies has led to the first arrests in a crackdown on unscrupulous sober homes and drug-treatment providers in Palm Beach County, prosecutors said Tuesday.

Authorities arrested James Kigar, CEO of Whole Life Recovery, a substance abuse treatment facil-

ity in Boynton Beach, and Christopher Lee Hutson, an operations consultant. The men were charged with patient brokering, a felony offense.

Kigar, 55, and Hutson, 36, are accused of illegally paying a confidential informant who worked for a sober home for patient referrals, according to a probable cause affidavit released Tuesday.

Investigators started their

### Man who tried to cash fake \$1B bond was duped, his lawyer says

A man who now admits that he tried to cash a counterfeit \$1 billion dollar bond in Broward County was duped, his lawyer said.

But Hugo Barrios Brecino knows he committed a federal crime and that he should have done more to check whether the document was authentic before trying to cash it, his attorney said.

Barrios Brecino, 50, pleaded guilty to a conspiracy charge Tuesday in federal court in Fort Lauderdale. The prosecution and defense have agreed to recommend a punishment of two years in federal prison when he is sentenced in January.

"Even though he was duped, he wants to do the right thing and admit that what he did was wrong," defense lawyer Albert

## Mendes, Marsalis and 'Pink Panther' coming in '17

On Monday, the Festival of the Arts Boca announced that bossa nova king Sergio Mendes and lanky, animated cat Pink Panther will lead the 2017 bill of concerts, films and author appearances in Boca Raton.

Tickets will go on sale at Nov. 1 for the March 2-12 festival of top-tier thinkers and performers, with admission ranging from \$9.99 to \$125 per show at FestivalBoca.org.

The 75-year-old Mendes and his rechristened band Brasil 2017 will close out the showcase March 12 at Mizner Park Amphitheater. Mendes, an epitome of 1960s cool who pioneered a brand of bossa nova-jazz fusion, is touring the 50th anniversary release of "Herb Alpert Presents Sergio Mendes & Brasil '66." Alpert and his wife, Brasil '66 lead singer Lani Hall, performed at the festival in 2015.

The \$9.99 performance belongs to "La Boheme" (7:30 p.m. March 4), a stripped-down version of the opera with full costumes but few elaborate set pieces under the baton of conductor Constantine Kitsopoulos. Over the summer, Kitsopoulos raised \$18,000 via Kickstarter to offset ticket prices for the opera, performed with the Sympho-

nia, Boca Raton. Kitsopoulos and the Symphonia will also join Grammy-winning saxophonist Branford Marsalis for a 7 p.m. March 3 program celebrating the soundtracks of film composer John Williams ("Star Wars," "Harry Potter," "Jaws").

Kitsopoulos will also join University of Miami's Henry Mancini Institute Orchestra for a screening of the 1963 comedy-mystery classic "The Pink Panther," which spawned the iconic pink cat and bafflingly inept French detective Inspector Clouseau, played originally by Peter Sellers. The score, created by Mancini, will be performed at 7:30 p.m. March 11 by the orchestra while the film plays.

Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist Jennifer Egan ("A

Visit From the Goon Squad") will top the lineup of authors at 7 p.m. March 2, possibly bearing her forthcoming novel, "Manhattan Beach." Also appearing are New Yorker cartoon editor Bob Mankoff, Pulitzer Prize-winning historian Jon Meacham ("American Lion: Andrew Jackson in the White House") and theoretical physicist Brian Greene ("The Elegant Universe").

Festival of the Arts Boca will take place March 2-12 at Mizner Park Amphitheater, 590 Plaza Real, and Mizner Park Cultural Arts Center, 201 Plaza Real, in Boca Raton. Tickets cost \$9.99-\$125. For the full schedule, call 866-571-2787 or go to FestivalBoca.org.

## Schumer slammed for Beyonce parody

Amy Schumer is brushing off critics who say her parody of Beyonce's "Formation" video is racially insensitive.

The video features a sweaty Schumer dancing to the song alongside Goldie Hawn, Wanda Sykes and Joan Cusack. Some Twitter users are slamming the video on charges of cultural appropriation.

Beyonce's version of the clip showed the singer sitting atop a New Orleans police car sinking in floodwaters. It also includes images of a hooded black child facing police and graffiti scrawled on a wall that reads "Stop Shooting Us."

Schumer's YouTube video has three times as many negative votes as positive recommendations.

One commenter wrote on the video, "Racist... culturally appropriating other people's creations... you steal a song specifically representing empowerment of marginalized black women & mock the song? You are literally what's wrong with society. You should be ashamed of yourself. So disgusting."

Another added, "wow. just wow. racist much??"

The comedian responded on Instagram, thanking streaming music service Tidal for releasing what she calls a "tribute." Tidal is partially owned by Beyonce and her husband, Jay Z.
