Man dies in accidental shooting, cops say

A man died from what appears to be an accidental shooting in Sunrise early Saturday evening, police said.

Rescue crews were called to an apartment building on the 10100 block of Northwest 24th Place at about 6:30 p.m. Life-saving attempts were made, according to reports. Officer Chris Piper, a

spokesman for the Sunrise police, said it appears to be an accidental shooting, but officers were still on the scene investigating at 8 p.m. Police did not identify the man nor give his age.

Mayoral debate takes place Jan. 4 in Fort Lauderdale

FORT LAUDERDALE — The South Florida Sun Sentinel will host a debate among the candidates for Fort Lauderdale mayor.

When is the debate?
It runs from 7:30 to 9 p.m.-Jan. 4.

Where is it?
The debate will be in the Abdo New River Room at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, 201 SW Fifth Ave., Fort Lauderdale.

Who are the candidates?

There are three candidates: Bruce Roberts, Charlotte Rodstrom and Dean Trantalis.

Roberts, 69, a Coral Ridge resident, has lived in Fort Lauderdale since he was a teenager and graduated from Cardinal Gibbons High School. A city commissioner since 2009, he worked for 35 years with the Fort Lauderdale Police Department and eventually became police chief. While chief, he promoted from within, which led the way for Frank Adderley to advance to chief, the city's first African-American to do so. Roberts said his focus is on applying his leadership skills to finding solutions. He is proud of the city's low unemployment rate and the securing of a long-term lease for the annual Fort



Lauderdale International Boat Show.

Rodstrom, 64, has lived in Fort Lauderdale almost all of her life and is president of the Nurmi Isles Homeowner Association. She's a former Fort Lauderdale commissioner, 2006-12, and now manages personal rental property and works as a medical billing specialist. She and her husband, former Broward County Commissioner John Rodstrom, raised three sons. She says she's focused on curbing wasteful spending, fighting for residents against incompatible development and keeping the city's infrastructure needs paramount.

Trantalis, 64, is a Poinsettia Heights resident who moved to Fort Lauderdale 35 years ago. A city commissioner, he served from 2003 to 2006 and from 2013 to present. Trantalis' public service began with his involvement in the fight for LGBT equal rights. Trantalis manages a legal practice and is focused on protecting the city's neighbor-

hoods, repairing the city's infrastructure, easing traffic congestion and pursuing smart-growth policies to prevent overdevelopment.

Who are the panelists?
There are three panelists: Rosemary O'Hara, Sun Sentinel Editorial Page editor; Brittany Wallman, Sun Sentinel senior reporter; and Tom Hudson, vice president of news at WLRN radio.

When is the election?
A primary election will take place Jan. 16. If no candidate receives more than 50 percent plus one vote, a runoff will take place March 13.

The debate will be livestreamed on SunSentinel.com.





