## Sing-along 'Bohemian Rhapsody' screening at Boca Raton's Mizner Park

The free sing-along screening of "Bohemian Rhapsody" at Mizner Park Amphitheater in Boca Raton on Friday night is not news to a Queen fanatic like you. As your long-suffering friends will attest, you live to sing "Don't Stop Me Now" at the top of your lungs in public. You'll put your "Galileo! Galileo!" up against anybody's.

The 2018 musical biopic about

Queen vocalist Freddie Mercury, rated PG-13, follows the singer's life from the formation of the band up to their legendary 1985 Live Aid performance at London's Wembley Stadium. A nominee for the Best Picture Oscar, "Bohemian Rhapsody" won four Academy Awards, including Rami Malek's for best actor.

The renewed interest in Queen prompted another tour by the band, now led by Adam Lambert, which stops at the BB&T Center

in Sunrise on Aug. 17. (Visit [TheBBTCenter.com](http://TheBBTCenter.com) for information on tickets.)

There is, of course, more to "Bohemian Rhapsody" than big hits such as "Somebody to Love," "We Will Rock You," "Under Pressure" and "We Are the Champions." There are more obscure songs, which fit perfectly with the narrative of the film, but can be sung by only the few. Such as yourself. The soundtrack includes the Queen concert staple "Now

I'm Here" (from the 1974 album "Sheer Heart Attack"), "Who Wants to Live Forever?" (moving, even if it was written for the soundtrack to "Highlander") and the poignant "The Show Must Go On" (the final track from 1991's "Innuendo," the final Queen album released before Mercury's death in 1991).

Not that it's a competition, but it's on those songs where you will win sing-along "Bohemian Rhapsody." Definitely.

They know you like to warm up, so there will be karaoke for all from 7:30 p.m. to 8:15 p.m., with the movie starting at sunset (about 8:15 p.m.). Not that you need the encouragement, but there will be beverages (and food) for sale at the venue. Guests can bring their own chairs and blankets, and chairs can be rented for \$5. But, of course, you do not sit for Freddie Mercury.

## Parkland gunman was searched every morning

Procedure revealed in deposition from Marjory Stoneman Douglas security guard

The former student who later shot up Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School was such a threat in school that he was searched every morning for weapons, new testimony shows.

The extraordinary measure followed an earlier decision to bar Nikolas Cruz from taking a backpack to campus after he talked of suicide and wrote "kill" in a notebook.

The search procedure was revealed in a sworn deposition

from Kelvin Greenleaf, the security guard who searched Cruz. The South Florida Sun Sentinel obtained a copy of the deposition this week.

"Never found a weapon on him," Greenleaf explained in the testimony July 11. "I think we got concerned when, I think, we found out he drank bleach, tried to hurt himself or something like that, the kid. That's when we

started, like, having the kid come in every morning to be searched by me, but never found a weapon on the kid, never."

Administrators forced Cruz to withdraw from Stoneman Douglas within six months — in

February 2017.

He walked onto the Parkland campus a year later and fatally shot 14 students and three educators with an assault-style rifle. He's facing the death penalty.

The district did not respond Thursday to a request for comment about Greenleaf's statements.

## Sheriff to look into Epstein's work release

Criminal investigation to focus on Palm Beach County deputies' handling of case

Palm Beach County Sheriff Ric Bradshaw has opened a criminal investigation into how his deputies handled wealthy financier Jeffrey Epstein's work release about a decade ago, an agency spokeswoman said Thursday.

The sheriff launched an internal investigation on Friday and then broadened it to a criminal probe on Tuesday, spokeswoman Teri Barbera said. She offered no additional details, other than sharing a statement that Bradshaw wants to "hold those accountable for any failures and ensure

that it won't happen again."

Bradshaw, who was sheriff when Epstein was at the jail, has been under mounting pressure to agree to an outside, independent investigation of how the agency handled the matter. The four-term sheriff was first elected in 2004, and he has indicated he will run for re-election next year.

State Sen. Lauren Book, D-Plantation, sent a letter Monday to Gov. Ron DeSantis asking him to order a Florida Department of Law Enforcement investigation into Epstein's work-release agreement.

## Florida's, Puerto Rico's futures are tangled

When Ricardo Rosselló announced that he would resign as governor of Puerto Rico on Wednesday night, it meant something for Florida.

The state is home to 1.2 million Puerto Ricans, the largest diaspora of Puerto Ricans in the U.S. and a diaspora that has grown tremendously in the past two decades — 110% between 2000 and 2014 alone. But more consequential is that

## Court: Woman can sue over alleged gang rape

Royal Caribbean can face a lawsuit over a woman's claim that cruise ship employees should have intervened to prevent her from being gang-raped during a 2015 cruise, an appellate court has ruled.

The decision by the 11th Circuit Court of Appeals in Miami reversed a lower court ruling that dismissed the suit for failing to state a claim.

The woman, identified in the suit as K.T., said the alleged attack happened aboard Oasis of the Seas on Dec. 26, 2015, while the then-Massachusetts resident was on a seven-day cruise from Port Everglades with her two sisters and grandparents. K.T.'s age at the time was not specified in the original lawsuit but is believed to have been between 15 and
